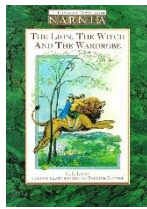


English:

This term Year 4 will use the heritage text *The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe* by C. S. Lewis as a basis for their writing where they will aim to compose and publish a first person descriptive narrative. They will explore a wide range of sentence openers and how these effect and interesting writing.



They will go on to study a short film called *Evolve* and develop their visual literacy by writing a diary entry of the main character.

In reading, year 4 will continue to study a wide range of texts based around cats, *A Series of Unfortunate events*, Books that have been made into movies and *The Romans*.

Physical Education:

Invasion and striking games – Hockey.
In PE the children will develop their stick control, passing and understanding of the rules of hockey.



Religious Education:

The theme of RE this term is

Enlightenment – Vesak – Buddhism.

The children will research the importance of the Buddha's enlightenment to Buddhists and the festival of Vesak.



Modern Foreign Languages: French

In French the children will continue thier descriptions of capital cities and then revise masculine and feminine animals and colour adjectives.

PSHE:

Following the SCARF programme of study, the children will be focusing on *Being my Best*. They will look at their differences and choices and how to make the best decisions for themselves.



Computing:

This term Year 4 will be looking Digital photography - creating media. They will be able to crop an image, apply filters and effects to a photo and deepen their understanding that photos can be manipulated



Mathematics:

Children this term will look at a wide range of topics including:

- Statistics – Carroll and Venn diagrams and table
- Multiplication and division – times tables and bus stop method with a remainder
- Geometry – triangles and geometric shapes
- Measurements – money and length
- Fractions

Summer Term 1

Create (Curriculum Support)

Art and Design:

To support their learning in History, the children will have the opportunity to look at Anglo-Saxon art and craft through artefacts.

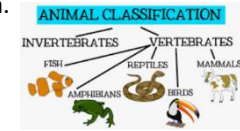
Music:

Year 4 will continue to learn how to play the bass line of Rock and Roll music for the fist half of this half term. They will then go on to study the sounds of Samba and Carnival in preparation for the Ryde Mardi Gras.

STEM

Science:

Year 4 children will look at animal and plant classification. They will be able to group animal and plants in different ways as well as developing their observations skills to make a classification key. They will recognise and describe different habitats and their inhabitants and go on to explore the effects of human activity and natural disasters on them.



Discover

History

Year 4 will discover the impact the Anglo-Saxons had on Britain when they invaded after the Romans. They will be able to identify the features of Anglo-Saxon settlement and use artefacts to inform their thinking about Sutton Hoo. They will develop their opinions on Alfred the great and understand how the Saxon rule ended.

Explore (Curriculum Support)

Geography:

To support their learning in History, the children will be able to identify the 5 Kingdoms of Anglo-Saxon Britain and how they relate to Britain's geography today. They will also be able to locate the site of Sutton Hoo on a map.
