

# Year 1

Year 1 have been working extra hard this week in Maths looking at how we use a ruler and measure, looking at clocks and being able to recognise when the clock is showing o'clock and half past. In English they have been writing sentences about the morning routine of school using colourful semantics to help them structure their sentences. In Science we have been looking at different plants and different trees and how the leaves are different. In History we have been looking at Osborne House and the Swiss Cottage and where they are situated on the Island and the history of the houses.









# Year 2

This week, Year 2 have worked extremely hard in all lessons. In Maths, they have been applying their calculation skills to solve different arithmetic problems. In English, the children have been focusing on their reading comprehension. They have demonstrated their understanding of texts presented in different ways by answering retrieval and sequencing style questions. In ICT, the children continued to develop their competency while using different software on iPads and laptops in order to solve the problems Mr Fessey has set for them. #### Why high attendance is important for education

As a parent/carer you want the best for your children. Having a good education is an important factor in opening up more opportunities in adult life. Did you know that:

- a child who is absent a day of school per week misses an equivalent of two years of their school life
- 90% of young people with absence rates below 85% fail to achieve five or more good grades of GCSE and around one third achieve no GCSEs at all
- poor examination results limit young people's options and poor attendance suggests to colleges and employers that these students are unreliable

All absence at any stage leads to gaps in your child's learning. This in turn can:

- mean that they fall behind in work
- affect their motivation
- affect their enjoyment of learning
- lead to poor behaviour
- affect their ability to have or keep friendships.

#### Supporting your child's school attendance

Good school attendance habits are best started early. Children learn from those around them and you as parents/carers set the standards and expectations for your child.
