Open Day at The law Courts

The Isle of Wight Law Courts are having an Open Day on Saturday 28th September. It is suitable for all ages and the day will be free to attend. A few examples of the things that will go on:

The Resident Judge will be doing an interactive event in the Crown Court titled "The Devil & The Law"

The Court Cells will be open (Tours will be given)

There will be a Prison van on site

There will be a Police Car, Police Officers and Police Dogs as well as much more.

There will also be a number of stalls on the main court landing with majority of our partner agencies, many of those will show their involvement with the Court. They will also show how you can have a career with them; from being a Magistrate to working in Security and everything in between.

The Youth Justice Service will also be in attendance and will show the work they do with families and the support they can give.

- What do you think a cell looks like?





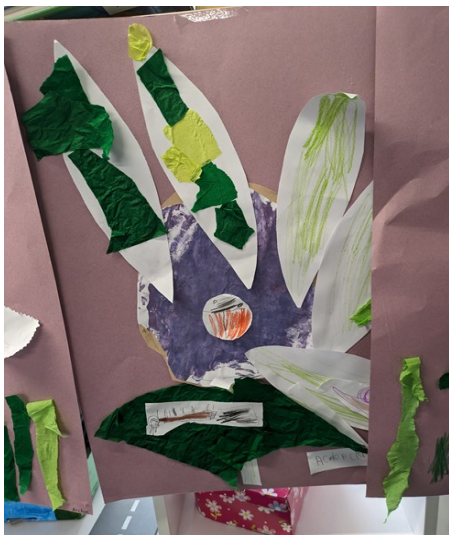
Pre-school

Year 4

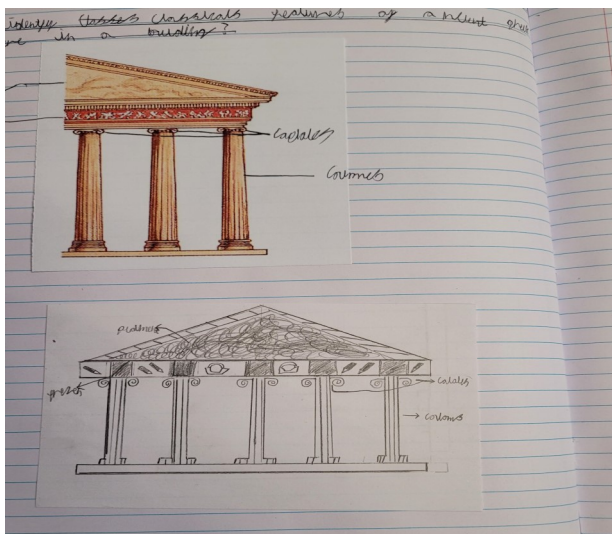

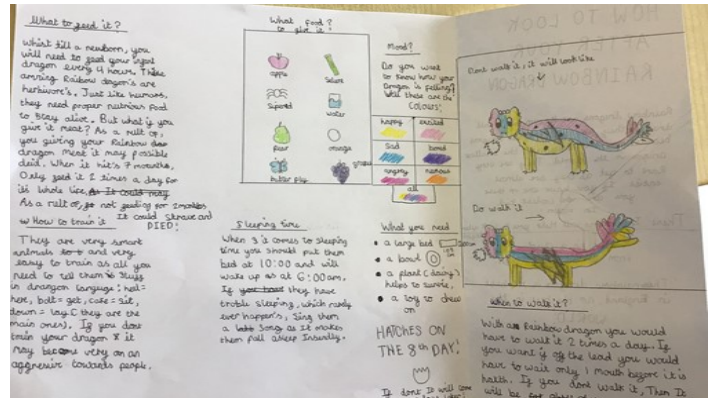
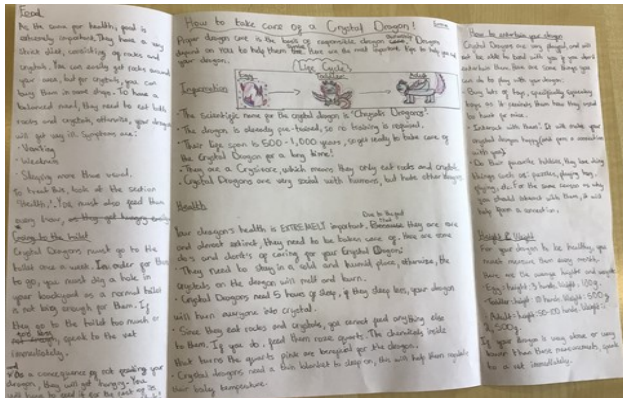
Year 5

Year 5 have continued their hard work despite it being the last week before half-term. In English we have been writing narratives based on the book *Who let the Gods out?*, making sure that we have included all of the features that we have learnt about this half-term. In History, we looked at Ancient Greek architecture and how we can still see it in buildings today. We then had a go at designing our own buildings with Ancient Greek features.



Year 6

This week the children have been working extremely hard to improve the quality of their writing - making sure that it is not only well punctuated but that both the sentences and text are well-structured. They have been reminded of different sentence types which includes: De:De, subordination, fronted adverbials, relative clauses, 2A, ..ing openers and the use of modal verbs. They have written a letter of thanks and an explanatory text. In History, we have continued our topic on Ancient Greece and will continue this after the half term. In PSHE, after watching Newsround, we had an excellent discussion about smart phones and when we thought children should be allowed one - the consensus was that maybe at 10/11 with parental controls but definitely by 15.

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

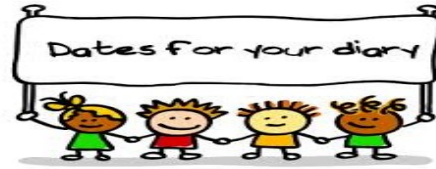

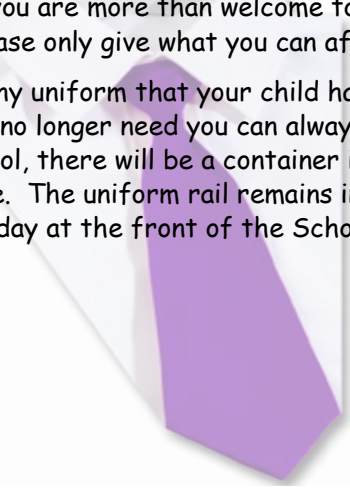


School Uniform

Why high attendance is important for education

As a parent/carer you want the best for your children. Having a good education is an important factor in opening up more opportunities in adult life. Did you know that:

- a child who is absent a day of school per week misses an equivalent of two years of their school life
- 90% of young people with absence rates below 85% fail to achieve five or more good grades of GCSE and around one third achieve no GCSEs at all
- poor examination results limit young people's options and poor attendance suggests to colleges and employers that these students are unreliable

All absence at any stage leads to gaps in your child's learning. This in turn can:

- mean that they fall behind in work
- affect their motivation
- affect their enjoyment of learning
- lead to poor behaviour
- affect their ability to have or keep friendships.

Supporting your child's school attendance

Good school attendance habits are best started early. Children learn from those around them and you as parents/carers set the standards and expectations for your child.
