Pre-school

This week in preschool we have made the most of the beautiful weather and enjoyed some time in the sun. The children have enjoyed lots of water play and using the hose pipe. 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




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
Year 1

Year 1 have all worked really hard this week. In English the children have looked at exclamations marks and how to use them in sentences. In maths the children have looked at one more and one less numbers, and have done some problem solving using their 10 and 20 number bonds. In art the children have been looking at different sculptures, what they liked and disliked, and looking at the differences.



Year 2

This week Year 2 have focused their attention on the formal methods of addition and subtraction in maths. They have looked at how, and when to carry and exchange a ten, and then applied their collation method to problem-solving activities. In science, we have begun to explore the new topic of animal lifecycles. As you can see from the photos, the children looked at the different stages of a human life cycle and what skills they would be able to perform at different stages in the cycle. We are excited to look at other mammals life cycles over the coming weeks.







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Year 3

Year 3 have been experimenting with different materials in art this week, using a plastic bottle and seeing how they could change it. They used different papers, paint and tools to cut and stick, then evaluated what they found worked, and what they would do differently next time. The children have restarted their ukulele lessons and are enjoying learning how to play, and understand the basic notes. In maths, we have been looking at money and how to add, and subtract different amounts of money.




Year 4


Year 6


School Meals

Why high attendance is important for education

As a parent/carer you want the best for your children. Having a good education is an important factor in opening up more opportunities in adult life. Did you know that:

- a child who is absent a day of school per week misses an equivalent of two years of their school life
- 90% of young people with absence rates below 85% fail to achieve five or more good grades of GCSE and around one third achieve no GCSEs at all
- poor examination results limit young people's options and poor attendance suggests to colleges and employers that these students are unreliable

All absence at any stage leads to gaps in your child's learning. This in turn can:

- mean that they fall behind in work
- affect their motivation
- affect their enjoyment of learning
- lead to poor behaviour
- affect their ability to have or keep friendships.

Supporting your child's school attendance

Good school attendance habits are best started early. Children learn from those around them and you as parents/carers set the standards and expectations for your child.
