


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Dear Parents and Carers.









Year 2




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Year 3



It has been a busy couple of weeks in Year 3 and the children had a great transition day where they experienced life as a Year 4 class.


In Maths, we have been learning more about time and reading time to the nearest 5 minutes.

Year 4

This week Year 4 conducted an investigation: Does the viscosity of a liquid affect how quickly it flows? The children planned the investigation and thought carefully about their variables, carried out a fair investigation and analysed the data they collected. They created a poster of their findings which they presented to the class. The investigation gave the children an opportunity to work together on a project and develop their scientific language and skills.

It has been a busy week in Year 5 this week. The children enjoyed their transition day in Year 6 and came back excited about being top of the school next year. In Art, we started to construct our Picasso inspired sculptures in which the children had a go at using a wide range of materials.

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

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

Why high attendance is important for education

As a parent/carer you want the best for your children. Having a good education is an important factor in opening up more opportunities in adult life. Did you know that:

- a child who is absent a day of school per week misses an equivalent of two years of their school life
- 90% of young people with absence rates below 85% fail to achieve five or more good grades of GCSE and around one third achieve no GCSEs at all
- poor examination results limit young people's options and poor attendance suggests to colleges and employers that these students are unreliable

All absence at any stage leads to gaps in your child's learning. This in turn can:

- mean that they fall behind in work
- affect their motivation
- affect their enjoyment of learning
- lead to poor behaviour
- affect their ability to have or keep friendships.

Supporting your child's school attendance

Good school attendance habits are best started early. Children learn from those around them and you as parents/carers set the standards and expectations for your child.
