We took part in Go Yellow Day today in aid of Mountbatten Hospice and we raised £137.00. Thank you everyone, you all looked amazing!







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
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


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Pre-school


This week in Preschool we have been focusing on the children's interests and creating models. The children have explored the different features of the objects and used the different shapes to finish their models.






Reception

The children have all learnt how to play and using their new skill of subitising (quick counting) they have been matching both picture and dot dominoes. We have enjoyed starting to learn about harvest, digging out our own pumpkin and drawing fruit baskets.









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
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
Year 1 & 2


This week in Maths year one and two have looked at adding numbers using different methods.

In Year two, the children have represented their numbers using dienes and combined them to find a total. They have looked at how a number can move up and down a number line based on the operations of addition and subtraction.

The children very much enjoyed our scientific experiment of testing a materials absorbency and Mr. Knight's classroom did get a little bit wet! But that's why we love science!













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Year 3

It has been a packed week in Year 3, with the children really working hard in all lessons. In Maths, we have been looking at measurement, how to use a ruler and discussing what estimating means. In English, the children have been learning about using apostrophes for contraction and the children were surprised at how many contractions there were. In Science, we have been learning more about how we need food to make energy and how different activities use different amounts of energy, for example; shovelling lots of dirt in the playground uses more energy than reading in the classroom. In Computing, the children were learning about making a short musical composition on the laptops.



Year 4

This week Year 4 have collaborated as a class to create and label a picture of the River Medina. This was inspired by map artwork of Grayson Perry and the vibrancy of New Zealand artist Craig Platt. They all explored how an animal's poo can indicate their diet and, therefore, their teeth in Science.









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Year 5


Year 5 are continuing their hard work right up until the last week of half term. We have been continuing to research and learn new information about rainforests by creating retrieval clocks. On Friday, we were lucky enough to visit a space dome at Summerfields Primary School where we started to store lots of information in our heads in preparation for our space science topic.






Year 6

This week we have built upon our knowledge of addition and subtraction to calculate multi step problems (have a go at the one below!). In writing we are building a variety of sentence structures to use in our final piece- the focus has been: using a semi colon and parenthesis. In reading we have discussed tools that 'Fred' could have found useful when he found himself in the amazon: pen knife, shovel, fire-stick!



Why high attendance is important for education

As a parent/carer you want the best for your children. Having a good education is an important factor in opening up more opportunities in adult life. Did you know that:

- a child who is absent a day of school per week misses an equivalent of two years of their school life
- 90% of young people with absence rates below 85% fail to achieve five or more good grades of GCSE and around one third achieve no GCSEs at all
- poor examination results limit young people's options and poor attendance suggests to colleges and employers that these students are unreliable

All absence at any stage leads to gaps in your child's learning. This in turn can:

- mean that they fall behind in work
- affect their motivation
- affect their enjoyment of learning
- lead to poor behaviour
- affect their ability to have or keep friendships.

Supporting your child's school attendance

Good school attendance habits are best started early. Children learn from those around them and you as parents/carers set the standards and expectations for your child.
