Reception








Year 1




Year 3

In Maths, we have been looking at capacity and volume and understanding the difference between the two. In Music, the children have been writing their song lyrics and in PE they have been playing football. In Science, the children have been consolidating their learning around light and shadow and thinking carefully about how light interacts with different surfaces and materials.









Year 5


Year 5 have continued their hard work despite the warming weather and it being the last week. In Geography, we looked at some map skills and started to look at 6-figure grid references to pinpoint locations on OS maps. In Maths, we had another look at formal methods for multiplication and division with great success.





Year 6

Year 6 have been very busy this week completing their non-chronological report about imaginary flora or fauna that they have created. They have been using the structure and features of a report to produce some very interesting pieces. In Maths we have been focusing on problem solving, especially the use of annotation and models to help us unpick what the problem is asking us. In Geography we have been using four figure grid references to locate objects on an OS map and extending this to six figures. The children found 'Pacman' very useful for this.

Why high attendance is important for education

As a parent/carer you want the best for your children. Having a good education is an important factor in opening up more opportunities in adult life. Did you know that:

- a child who is absent a day of school per week misses an equivalent of two years of their school life
- 90% of young people with absence rates below 85% fail to achieve five or more good grades of GCSE and around one third achieve no GCSEs at all
- poor examination results limit young people's options and poor attendance suggests to colleges and employers that these students are unreliable

All absence at any stage leads to gaps in your child's learning. This in turn can:

- mean that they fall behind in work
- affect their motivation
- affect their enjoyment of learning
- lead to poor behaviour
- affect their ability to have or keep friendships.

Supporting your child's school attendance

Good school attendance habits are best started early. Children learn from those around them and you as parents/carers set the standards and expectations for your child.
