

English (Reading and writing):

Text drivers/books to share:

- Where the wild things are
- The day the crayons quit

Reading: This term, we are continuing with our phonics scheme, RWI, to improve our reading skills.

Writing: We are focussing on writing skills such as alliteration, patterns and rhymes. We will be writing our own post cards at the end of term. The class will be undertaking a lot more independent writing this half term.

Mathematics:

This term we will be approaching measure for the first time. Beginning with measuring length in non-standard units, such as blocks, the class will gain skills that can be used in all aspects of life. We will then measure in standard units (cm) and order objects by their size. Following this we will be measuring capacity and weight... even beginning to measure time!

The class will continue to practice number formation and we are always pushing to improve number sense.

Physical Education (Invasion games):

In PE, the class will be introduced to new ways of moving in athletics, such as jumping for both distance and height. Jumping skills are required across all aspects of PE.

Religious Education:

In RE this term, we will be looking at the events of Easter Week and creating our own palm leaves. The children are very excited to learn about this time of the year!

CREATE: (Curriculum Support)

Music: We will continue to follow our music programme on charanga and learn about the rhythm and beat of the music. The class will be introduced to tempo and dynamics with a focus on how music makes the world a better place. Mrs Cooper will be leading our music lessons.

Art: In art, we will be focussing on our drawing skills. The class will aim to be proficient in their drawing technique and can use these skills to develop and share their ideas, experience, and imagination. We have now introduced new materials to use in art such as crayons, pastels, and paint.

PSHE:

We will continue to follow our PSHE programme on SCARF. This term we will be looking at valuing difference with Mrs Young. The children will have mature conversations around important issues.

STEAM:

Science: This half term, we will continue to develop their knowledge of plants. The class will be taught to identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees. Additionally learning how to identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees. We are growing our own class plants too!

Computing: This term the children will develop their understanding of the various aspects of using a computer to programme and animate characters to move across the screen. This will use their skills learnt in the year so far with the laptops.

Explore: Geography (Curriculum Support)

This term, we will be exploring the similarities and differences in relation to places, objects, materials and living things.
